If you've been keeping up with our story over the last several years, this book is the final installment. On December 31, 2023, we served our last beers and threw one hell of a farewell party on our way out. The decision to close was not one we made voluntarily; after years of conflict with our landlords over a second taproom expansion, we were no longer able to sustain operations in our space, and relocation wasn't an option. Our hearts broke when we made the official public announcement in early November.

Bone Up meant a lot to a lot of people, and there's nobody who understood that better than us because this place meant *everything* to us. We (Liz and Jared) had Bone Up as the primary focal point of our lives for most of a decade, and during that time we took a decrepit, abandoned industrial space and turned it into a weird little brewery featuring beer that mostly just confused people and from there a full-on *community* developed, and that's really goddamn special. Like, you see the word "community" thrown around a lot by people who work in marketing (or at least we do, it's beyond overused in the craft beer sphere) but our people were some of the most genuine (and, often but not always, genuinely weird) and welcoming people that we could ever hope to meet. It's not that we ever did anything wildly unusual, but we know what we like and not everything we're into is gonna be for everyone; y'all gave us the opportunity to do the kinds of things that we want to see in the world and that's increasingly rare these days (hell, given the direction Boston seems to be moving in, it's more and more rare to see a place around here with any personality at all).

The legacy we'll remember is all the cool stuff that's happened because of Bone Up - the beers for dogs and the beers for weddings (hell, you could make the case that we've been indirectly responsible for several marriages happening. Up to three, depending on how much credit you're willing to give us) and beers for bands and the kickball league and adventures with staff and all the good times we get to have at the anniversary and Horatio Day also all our other weird made-up holidays that everyone just... rolled with because y'all are cool like that and above all that's the thing we keep coming back to - we've made friends with a lot of great people that we otherwise wouldn't have met if not for Bone Up, and we know a lot of you out there will say the same. We had something magical here, and we'll all be a little poorer without Horatio in our lives, but we're grateful it got to happen at all.

Getting back to the point, this book will mostly be ignoring the Elephant In The Room in favor of focusing on all the Good Stuff that happened. It might feel a little... revisionist, but we spent enough time griping about the bullshit, and anyway, it's kind of our whole thing to find a way to party even when the shit gets too real. Enjoy the ride!


Also, we had our very first Mug Club social the Friday before (buying extra cake was a good call), dished out our favorite glassware to date, and a great time was had by all!

that we learned so many SQUID FACTS!





























SUMMER AT THE BREWERY






















































CHALKBOARD REDO


















RETURN OF THE AIRNESS
















THE TAPROOM TURNS SEVEN 08.24.23-08.27.23

























































WEDDING BEERS

In between drinkin' Extra Funky and our 700th batch, Macon hit his one year mark in the fall, and Jared made him a gorgeous




























































THE LONG GOODBYE















































THANKSGIVING BEER PAIRINGS

And if you don't have any Blue Manic, we suggest... just putting the entire frozen turkey in the microwave to defrost. What's the worst that could happen?

















THE FINAL HORATIO DAY






























THE LAST TRIVIA NIGHTS



We tried to capture as many moments as possible during our last couple weeks, and they were filled with so much love and bittersweet farewells.
























































THE FINAL DAYS






























































































































































































































IT'S BEEN AN HONOR AND A PLEASURE.
